One of the extreme sides of the spectrum. Actions that lead the user to interrupt their use contribute directly to strengthening the "anvil". Tendency to become part of space "B" and a direct connection to space "C".





Located in spectrum at a greater distance from the action of the "anvil" than the space "A". The links with space "C" are increasingly closer.

This space is the base of the drug traffic pyramid. "Trafficker dealers", mules, drug den operators, etc. It includes small producers and drug intermediaries.


THE HAMMER AND ANVIL STRATEGY

ESSENTIAL POINT ACTIONS


> Actions to reduce supply, to offer treatment and those targeting drug users are necessary, but they occur within the universe of consequences. Only primary prevention actions – education, information, training – take place before drugs can have an effect and only they can achieve lasting results, that is, they come to stay.




f we consider that traffickers do not force anyone to buy drugs, but instead identify people's weaknesses in order to seduce them, an investment in mobilizing and training society to act ahead of traffickers by eliminating its vulnerable points, enables the creation of a protective shield – the anvil – that will make it more confident, and will offer better conditions for the success of its efforts to reduce supply.



Point actions in all spaces of the spectrum, coordinated among themselves as a matter of course in order to contribute to the progressive efficacy of the main action, are essential to keep adverse forces under permanent pressure.



> It should be highlighted that the Government takes part in both actions of the main effort through the National Antidrug System. On the other hand, while police forces have a preponderant role in the actions of the "hammer", it is up to **society** to take most of the responsibility for the success of the actions of the "anvil".



To "close the fan" is the objective to be followed with determination, planning and well defined priorities. The time has come to direct our attention to the frailty of the "anvil". Without giving it due priority, we will be reduced to the point actions.



In Brazil, the strategy of bringing the actions of the National Antidrug Policy to the municipalities – the central nucleus of the "anvil" in this FAN THEORY – is characterized by the high priority bestowed upon it by the National Antidrug Secretariat – SENAD and further bodies of the National Antidrug System, where an integrated action with the 27 State Antidrug Councils is highlighted. The response of society to the call for mobilization and training is reflected in the progressive participation of its various organized segments and in the growing number of Municipal Antidrug Councils being implemented and those already implemented.

The Pilot Project to Integrate Border Municipalities in Demand Reduction Programs, supported by the Interamerican Commission for the Control of Drug Abuse -**CICAD**, is an example that Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Paraguay and Uruguay offer as regards a significant and determined investment in the "anvil", which will hopefully be our starting point to a successful end to our confrontation with the drugs issue.
